




THE QUESTION OF OWNERSHIP CAN REALLY UNLOCK ETHICAL QUESTIONS. OFTEN LABOR IS SHARED AMONGST MANY IN COMMUNITY BASED WORK, YET THE OWNERSHIP IS GRANTED TO THOSE WHO HOLD INSTITUTIONAL POWER





